

PRODUCTION, MIXING, MASTERING WITH WAVES – BOOK SESSIONS UPDATE NOTES

Waves offers two ways to update your sessions:

1. A *Downloadable* version, containing the modified files and the sessions files. You will need to download both the session files and the audio files.
2. A *Do-It-Yourself* version, which includes only the modified sessions files. This version demands the alteration of certain audio files contained in the original CDs that come with the book. General instruction will follow.

Using the downloadable version:

1. Download the zipped sessions pack for the desired platform.
2. Download the zipped audio files.
3. Unzip the files.
4. Move the included audio files into your sessions' audio files folder.
5. Open the session with the new session file (marked as V5)
6. Relocate the audio files using the programs' dialogue.
7. Run the modified session.

Note: the old mono files that you received with your CDs can be removed. This is optional. It is not recommended that you do this unless you fully understand which files are disposable.

Using the Do-It-Yourself version:

This version involves a bit of work. It requires the user to produce new stereo files from the split mono files provided with the Books' CDs. The zipped files you download include a short list of the files that need modification.

1. Download the zipped files corresponding to the sessions you wish to use.
2. Unzip the files.
3. Open the attached document listing for the files that need modification.
4. Create a new session.
5. Import a pair of audio files. For example: Bassline L.wav & Bassline R.wav.
6. Pan these files hard left and hard right in your session.
7. Bounce the resulting mix to create a new stereo interleaved version of the files.
8. Rename the files according to the list supplied with each session.
9. Insert the resulting files into the sessions' audio files folder.
10. Open the session with the new session file (marked as V5)
11. Relocate the audio files using the programs' dialogue.
12. Run the modified session.
